



Screening for Risk and Resilience Factors



DESSA

Universal screening of social and emotional skills:

- Provides baseline data about students' resilience factors
- Focuses on prevention
- Builds on strengths



DESSA SEIR

Universal screening of emotional behavior risk domains:

 Provides baseline data about students' internalizing and externalizing risks

Snapshot of students' well-being

 Together, these data points provide information aligned with the resilience and risk approach to promote students' well-being

Promoting students' well-being is best done through a **Risk and Resilience framework** that focuses on two factors:



Development of resilience (protective factors)




Early identification and prevention of risk factors

Students who have well-developed resilience factors are better positioned to navigate challenges, and to mitigate and respond to risk factors.



Risk and Resilience Framework

- There are many risk and resilience factors that impact students. They are often classified as being 1) in the environment, 2) in the family, or 3) within the individual.
- Because we work in schools with educators, we focus on screening for risk and resilience factors that educators can affect.





Risk and Resilience Framework




- Most students will encounter challenges or risk factors – building up their protective factors helps them to be more resilient, and to navigate these challenges successfully.
- All students will benefit from a focus on building their resilience. Students facing more risk require more support in developing resilience factors.



Overview: The DESSA SEIR

DESSA SEIR Student Self-Report

- Reliable screener that assesses a broad range of emotional behavior risks
- Student completed for grades 6-12
- 10 items
- Two scores internalizing risks and externalizing risks
- Criterion-referenced scores are reported in three levels: no concern, possible concern, and concern
- Evidence of reliability and validity as a screener of emotional behavior risks



DESSA SEIR Results

DESSA SEIR results are categorized into three ranges for both Internalizing and Externalizing Risks: No Concern, Possible Concern, and Concern.

Concern Level	Internalizing Risks	Externalizing Risks
No Concern	0–6	0–4
Possible Concern	7–8	5–6
Concern	9–15	7–15







Dear Yara.

Think of someone that you admire and respect. What words come to mind when you think about this person? Examples might be:

- Friendly
- Trustworthy
- Responsible
- Positive

These words describe social and emotional skills. Research shows that these skills help us do well in school, in college, and at work. In fact, when employers were asked what skills they look for in a job applicant, half of the skills were social and emotional skills.

We want to make sure that you have these skills by the time you graduate. You are invited to fill out a survey called the DESSA. This survey will ask you to think about 55 social and emotional skills and how often you use them. You will get feedback on your strengths and your areas for growth. This feedback will help you choose skills you want to improve and set goals for yourself. The goal is for you to learn new strategies to help you succeed.

If you play a sport, you know that a good coach reinforces the skills you already have. They also help you improve skills that may need work. This helps you to be a more well-rounded athlete. The same is true with good art and music teachers and good bosses. This survey works the same way. It helps you find what you might already be really good at, what skills you do pretty well and what areas could get stronger.





- One bar indicates that this is a "Growth Opportunity" for you. You are not yet demonstrating a lot of these behaviors.








